Padilla has spent the last 13 years working closely with 54 public elementary school neighborhoods serving youth and their families as Executive Director of Every Neighborhood Partnership, a communitybased organization that mobilizes and supports residents in leading "neighborhood building teams" that actively serve on school campuses and in their surrounding communities.

Padilla was born and raised in Fresno. He attended California State University, Northridge, where he received his degree in Business Administration. Upon graduation he returned home and has worked in the nonprofit sector for over 28 years. In 2008, Padilla founded Every Neighborhood Partnership (ENP). With 10 staff and over 950 volunteers who donate more than 120,000 hours of community service every year in 54 neighborhoods throughout Fresno, ENP has grown to be one of the most comprehensive neighborhood services organizations in the region.

"I'm excited to join the team at the Central Valley Community Foundation. I've seen how they are taking a lead in our community's transformation, and I'm so glad to be a part of their ongoing work with DRIVE," said Artie. "I've learned so much at ENP, and I feel this is a great next step for me to best serve our families and neighborhoods."
